We can be enjoying our homes in a different way than in Winter and for those with gardens and patios the obvious thoughts are of barbecues, fire pits and garden furniture and every year we see new trends and more and more choice in the shops often at very good prices. As long as you have looked after last year's purchase and kept the Garden furniture wrapped from the winter elements it might just

need a good cleanup to be brought back into use and for those people without a garden or patio there is no reason why you can't bring the feeling of your garden indoors.

Just one word of warning when buying plant pots from somebody who found out many years ago the hard way! If the container has a little hole at the bottom for drainage then the container will be intended for outdoor use only

If you are buying new garden furniture this year and purchase the type with removable cushions I strongly advise the purchase of a weatherproof container not only for the winter but for rainy times as there is nothing more frustrating than having a lovely sunny day where you would like to sit outside and find the cushions are soaking wet from the day before.
